## **RESOLUTION OBSA-029**

A RESOLUTION OF THE OVERSIGHT BOARD OF THE SUCCESSOR AGENCY FOR THE SOLANA BEACH REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY APPROVING AND ADOPTING THE RECOGNIZED OBLIGATION PAYMENT SCHEDULE FOR THE 12-MONTH FISCAL YEAR PERIOD FROM JULY 1, 2016 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2017 (ROPS 16-17) AND MAKING RELATED DETERMINATIONS AND TAKING RELATED ACTIONS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH.

WHEREAS, the Solana Beach Redevelopment Agency ("Redevelopment Agency") was a redevelopment agency in the City of Solana Beach ("City"), duly created pursuant to the California Community Redevelopment Law (Part 1 (commencing with Section 33000) of Division 24 of the California Health and Safety Code) ("Redevelopment Law"); and

WHEREAS, the Redevelopment Agency was responsible for the administration of redevelopment activities within the City; and

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill No. X1 26 (2011-2012 1<sup>st</sup> Ex. Sess.) ("AB 26") was signed by the Governor of California on June 28, 2011, making certain changes to the Redevelopment Law and to the California Health and Safety Code ("Health and Safety Code"), including adding Part 1.8 (commencing with Section 34161) ("Part 1.8") and Part 1.85 (commencing with Section 34170) ("Part 1.85") to Division 24 of the Health and Safety Code; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to AB 26, as modified by the California Supreme Court on December 29, 2011 by its decision in *California Redevelopment Association v. Matosantos*, all California redevelopment agencies, including the Redevelopment Agency, were dissolved on February 1, 2012, and successor agencies were designated and vested with the responsibility of paying, performing and enforcing the enforceable obligations of the former redevelopment agencies and expeditiously winding down the business and fiscal affairs of the former redevelopment agencies; and

WHEREAS, on January 11, 2012, the City Council of the City adopted Resolution 2012-011, pursuant to Part 1.85 of AB 26, electing for the City to serve as the successor agency to the Redevelopment Agency upon the dissolution of the Redevelopment Agency under AB 26 ("Successor Agency"); and

WHEREAS, AB 26 has since been amended by various California assembly and senate bills enacted and signed by the Governor. AB 26 as amended is hereinafter referred to as the "Dissolution Laws"; and

WHEREAS, Health and Safety Code Section 34179 of the Dissolution Laws establishes a seven (7) member local entity with respect to each successor agency and

such entity is titled the "oversight board." The oversight board has been established for the Successor Agency (hereinafter referred to as the "Oversight Board") and all seven (7) members have been appointed to the Oversight Board pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 34179 of the Dissolution Laws. The duties and responsibilities of the Oversight Board are primarily set forth in Health and Safety Code Sections 34179 through 34181 of the Dissolution Laws; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 34171(h) of the Dissolution Laws, on and after July 1, 2016, "Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule" ("ROPS") means the document setting forth the minimum payment amounts and due dates of payments required by enforceable obligations for each fiscal year as provided in Section 34177(o) of the Health and Safety Code; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 34177(I)(3) of the Dissolution Laws, the ROPS shall be forward looking to the next one year in accordance with Health and Safety Code Section 34177(o); and

WHEREAS, according to Health and Safety Code Section 34177(I)(1) of the Dissolution Laws, the Successor Agency shall prepare a ROPS before each fiscal year period. For each recognized obligation, the ROPS shall identify one or more of the following sources of payment: (i) Low and Moderate Income Housing Funds, (ii) bond proceeds, (iii) reserve balances, (iv) administrative cost allowance, (v) the Redevelopment Property Tax Trust Fund but only to the extent no other funding source is available or when payment from property tax revenues is required by an enforceable obligation or by the provisions of Part 1.85 of the Dissolution Laws, and (vi) other revenue sources, including rents, concessions, asset sale proceeds, interest earnings, and any other revenues derived from the former Redevelopment Agency as approved by the Oversight Board in accordance with Part 1.85 of the Dissolution Laws; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 34177(a)(3) of the Dissolution Laws, the Successor Agency may only make payments required pursuant to an approved ROPS; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 34177 of the Dissolution Laws, the Successor Agency, on January 13, 2016, received the ROPS covering the 12-month fiscal year period from July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017 ("ROPS 16-17"), in substantial form attached to this Resolution as Exhibit "A", and the Successor Agency authorized the submission of the ROPS 16-17 to the Oversight Board for its approval; and

WHEREAS, the ROPS 16-17 is now being submitted to the Oversight Board for review and approval in accordance with Health and Safety Code Sections 34177(I)(2)(B) and 34180(g) of the Dissolution Laws; and

WHEREAS, the proposed ROPS 16-17 attached to this Resolution as Exhibit "A" is consistent with the requirements of the Health and Safety Code and other applicable law; and

WHEREAS, ROPS 16-17 contains the schedules for payments on enforceable obligations required of the Successor Agency for the applicable fiscal year period and sources of funds for payments as required pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 34177(I) of the Dissolution Laws; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 34177(o)(1) of the Dissolution Laws, the Successor Agency is required to submit the ROPS 16-17, after its approval by the Oversight Board, to the California Department of Finance ('Department of Finance") and the San Diego County Auditor-Controller ("County Auditor-Controller") no later than February 1, 2016. Section 34177(o)(1) further provides that the Department of Finance shall make its determination of the enforceable obligations and the amounts and funding sources of the enforceable obligations no later than April 15, 2016 and that the Successor Agency may, within 5 business days of the Department of Finance's determination, request additional review by the Department of Finance and an opportunity to meet and confer on disputed items. In the event of a meet and confer and request for additional review, the Department of Finance shall notify the Successor Agency and the County Auditor-Controller as to the outcome of its review at least 15 days before the date of the first property tax distribution for that period (i.e. before June 1, 2016); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 34177(I)(2)(C) of the Dissolution Laws, a copy of the Oversight Board-approved ROPS 16-17 shall be submitted to the County Auditor-Controller, the State Controller's Office and the Department of Finance and shall be posted on the Successor Agency's internet website; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 34177(o)(1)(A) of the Dissolution Laws, the Successor Agency shall submit a copy of the Oversight Board-approved ROPS 16-17 to the Department of Finance in the manner provided by the Department of Finance; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Dissolution Laws, the Oversight Board met at a duly noticed public meeting on January 14, 2016 to consider approval of the ROPS 16-17 among other approvals; and

WHEREAS, after reviewing the ROPS 16-17 presented to and recommended for approval to the Oversight Board by the Successor Agency, and after reviewing any written and oral comments from the public relating thereto, the Oversight Board desires to approve the ROPS 16-17; and

WHEREAS, the activity proposed for approval by this Resolution has been reviewed with respect to applicability of the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA"), the State CEQA Guidelines (California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Sections 15000 *et seq.*, hereafter the "Guidelines"), and the City's environmental guidelines; and

WHEREAS, the activity proposed for approval by this Resolution is not a "project" for purposes of CEQA, as that term is defined by Guidelines Section 15378, because such activity is an organizational or administrative activity that will not result in a direct or indirect physical change in the environment, per Section 15378(b)(5) of the Guidelines.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Oversight Board of the Successor Agency for the Solana Beach Redevelopment Agency hereby resolves and determines as follows:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. The foregoing recitals are true and correct, and, together with information provided by the Successor Agency and the public, form the basis for the approvals, resolutions, and determinations set forth below.

SECTION 2. The Oversight Board approves and adopts the ROPS 16-17 for the 12-month fiscal year period from July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017 in the form presented to the Oversight Board and attached hereto as Exhibit A which includes the approval of the agreements and obligations described in the ROPS 16-17, and determines that such agreements and obligations constitute "enforceable obligations" and "recognized obligations" for all purposes of the Dissolution Laws in connection with the ROPS 16-17.

SECTION 3. The Oversight Board has examined the items contained on the ROPS 16-17 and determines that each of them is necessary for the continued maintenance and preservation of property owned by the Successor Agency until disposition and liquidation, the continued administration of the enforceable obligations herein approved by the Oversight Board, and/or the expeditious wind-down of the affairs of the former Redevelopment Agency by the Successor Agency.

SECTION 4. The Oversight Board authorizes the Successor Agency to enter into any agreements and amendments to agreements necessary to implement the agreements and obligations listed on the ROPS 16-17 and herein approved by the Oversight Board unless Oversight Board approval of such Successor Agency action is otherwise required pursuant to the Dissolution Laws.

SECTION 5. The Oversight Board authorizes and directs the Successor Agency to submit copies of the ROPS 16-17 adopted by this Resolution as required under the Dissolution Laws, in the method required, and in a manner to avoid a late submission or accrual of any penalties. In this regard, the Executive Director, or designee, of the Successor Agency is hereby authorized and directed to: (i) submit the ROPS 16-17, as approved by the Oversight Board, to the Department of Finance and to the County Auditor-Controller no later than February 1, 2016; (ii) submit a copy of the ROPS 16-17, as approved by the Oversight Board, to the State Controller's Office and post the ROPS 16-17 on the Successor Agency's internet website; and (iii) revise the ROPS 16-17, and make such changes and amendments as necessary, before official submittal of the ROPS 16-17 to the Department of Finance in order to complete the ROPS 16-17 in the

manner provided by the Department of Finance and to conform the ROPS 16-17 to the form or format as prescribed by the Department of Finance.

SECTION 6. The Executive Director, or designee, of the Successor Agency is authorized and directed to take such other actions and execute such other documents as are necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

SECTION 7. The Oversight Board determines that the activity approved by this Resolution is not a "project" for purposes of CEQA, as that term is defined by Guidelines Section 15378, because the activity approved by this Resolution is an organizational or administrative activity that will not result in a direct or indirect physical change in the environment, per Section 15378(b)(5) of the Guidelines.

SECTION 8. This Resolution shall take effect at the time and in the manner prescribed in Health and Safety Code Sections 34177(o)(1) and 34179(h) of the Dissolution Laws.
